This project will 1) acknowledge and list the people buried at the site, 2) formally identify the area as a cemetery and 3) share the story of the cemetery's unique history. In collaboration with the Arrow Lakes Historical Society, relevant historical research has been completed and will guide the design of the signage. The Friends of the Burton Walkway will be working with Moraine Recreation Consulting, a West Kootenay business that offers expertise in sign design and mapping.

The New Nakusp Youth Centre project will create a youth-designed space dedicated to youth programming for ages 12-18. A priority is to incorporate input from our youth on the design and functionality of this development. Description:

Nav-CARE is a compassionate community-based program developed to improve the quality of life of adults with declining health. Adults living with serious illness or increased frailty, particularly those who do not yet qualify for home-based nursing care, often live with unmet needs and heavy symptom burden resulting in poor quality of life. Many do not know the services that are available. However, if these needs go unmet, the ability of clients to stay healthy or access healthcare can be compromised. Nav-CARE was designed to address these needs that fall outside of the responsibilities of healthcare providers.

Nav-CARE provides volunteers with a specially-designed training centered on quality of life concerns. Volunteers are then matched 1:1 with clients to assist with the client and family priorities. Volunteers have the luxury of time to engage, listen, support decision-making, and assist clients with practical things that help to meet their needs. Each Nav-CARE Coordinator supports her volunteers and coordinates service delivery with other local organizations. This funding request will support the growth of the West Kootenay Nav-CARE program, increasing the number of clients we are able to serve through public outreach and volunteer recruitment. The funding committed by each community or district will be invested specifically in their area.

KBRH Tier 3 Neonatal Intensive Care Unit	Kootenay Boundary Regional Hospital & Health Foundation Society	\$29,000	\$500

Description:

In September 2022 KBRH was approved for Tier 3 Nursery status, which will provide 3 nursery beds with 24/7 nursing. The Tier 3 Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) will provide neonatal services to newborns at approximately 34 weeks and 1800g, who present moderate risk requiring acute care. Furthermore, an urgent/emergent baby born at approximately 32 weeks and 1500g, with appropriate weight for gestational age, may be able to remain at KBRH's Tier 3 NICU.

This service increase allows repatriation of babies from Tiers 4-6 sites (Vancouver, Kelowna, Kamloops), to KBRH's NICU. The unit can also accept infants from Tier 1 and 2 sites, such as Kootenay Lake Hospital. Approval of the Tier 3 status also facilitated a new Pediatrician starting at KBRH in January 2023, growing the number of Pediatricians to 3.

The KBRH Health Foundation's Tier 3 NICU Project, will purchase priority medical equipment for the NICU. The total project (Phase 1 & 2) is \$648,353.26 with \$499,864.26 donated to date; \$148,489.58 remains outstanding and is the focus of this application.

The equipment required for Phase 2 of the project includes: 2 Cribettes, 1 Respiratory Cart, 4 Oxygen Blenders, 4 Vital Sign Monitors, 2 Optiflow Nasal Oxygen Therapy Devices and 3 Bedside Storage Tables.

Interior Health is hiring and training staff to support the NICU service enhancement.

Outdoor Flight Cage	Little Mittens Animal Rescue Association, Golden	\$11,000	\$500

Description:

When birds come into our care, they first get placed into a restricted activity cage. This gives them time to rest and heal. Once their injuries heal, they will need to build up strength before being released and this occurs in a large space where they can get some height and distance in flight.

This project will involve the purchase and assembly of an outdoor flight cage suitable for songbirds of all sizes. Standards for Wildlife Rehabilitation recommends circular flight cages as the best way to promote flight conditioning. The modular cage quoted from Custom Cages is a great starting point in developing our outdoor flight area. They are ideal as they provide the opportunity to add panels and expand the enclosure as needed. The double door (aka safety door) is important so that when staff or volunteers enter the cage, no birds will be able to escape before they are ready.

Any extra funds will go towards bird food (ie. seed, fruit, etc.)
